To name a few: Sacramento Hot Weather (cars & garages can heat up quickly

and become deadly), Fox Tails (dangerous stickers with sharp barbs), Burrs and Stickers (get tangled in paws and fur), Ticks (carry disease), Rattlesnakes (venomous), Black Widows (poisonous), Bee Stings, Snail Bait, Rat Poison, Fertilizer, Toxic Plants, Deep Water, Fast Moving River Water, Ocean Waves with undertow currents, Wildlife

(skunks, opossums, raccoons, coyotes, eagles, & mountain lions), to name a few.

Equally Important is securing your dogs (& cats) safely in your vehicle whether a trip around town or on a long vacation trip. Like small children it is equally important to secure them safely for both your and their safety! Do not leave loose, as is very dangerous, in an accident.

Examples: A Secured Crate (for dogs or cats), a Doggy Harness Seat Belt made for dogs, a vehicle doggy barrier made for SUVs, to name a few.

Water Safety: Use a Doggy Life Vest.


Pick a sport that compliments your dog's breed and temperament.

When shopping remember cheaper is not always better.

Picking a quality food or treats can enhance the health of your pet, produce less waste for you to clean up, feed less per meal, and help promote a healthy hair coat.

Poor quality foods can escalate aggression issues (just like sugar in children can lead to hyperactivity and cranky temperaments).

Look for whole food sources as the first ingredient (example: Fish, Salmon, Chicken, Beef, Lamb, or Turkey) versus "Meal", "By-Products", or "Animal Digest". Avoid large quantities of Corn. Avoid non identifiable sources (example: animal fat vs. chicken fat).

Look for desirable vitamins & preservatives. Learn to read pet food labels.

Importance of Annual Veterinarian Exams & Care


In today's economy it is easy to begin to want to skip things that may seem to save us a little money now (like annual exams by your Veterinarian).... That said health care for your pet is not the place to skip.

Annual Exams allow your Veterinarian a chance to look for potential health issues. Issues that if caught early can actually save you money over time and potential heartache.

Keeping up on your pet's annual check ups, vaccines, monthly heartworm medicine, flea & tick control are very important.

Between visits watch for any change in your pet's behavior, eating or drinking habits, stool, peeing, energy level, or lameness. If you have any concerns please contact your Veterinarian to discuss how you should proceed.

It is important you pick a Veterinarian you feel comfortable & confident with.


A great little

Homework? Yes! It is paramount you sit down and give serious thought about what age range (Puppy? Adolescent? Adult? or Senior?), breed, size, energy level, level of prey drive, and temperament which best fits your family and lifestyle. Are you

You need to decide where you want your puppy or dog to go potty now and in the future (Outside? Pee Pads? Litter Box?).

Utilize tools which can help set you and your puppy or dog up for success: crates, exercise pens, leashes, tethers, kitchen timer, black light, & urine cleaner, to name a

few

Management is the key.

Pay attention when they are loose 100% of the time, if vou cannot watch, then manage them. "Important to set them up for success". Lots of opportunities to go potty where you want them to go & reward versus practicing in undesirable locations.

Seek professional help early.
